May? Already?! It is hard to believe that there are two more months left in this school year! Plans for this year's Graduation Celebration will be underway soon. Ours will be on Friday, June 23rd (more details forthcoming).

April was busy and seemed to fly by quickly. We ended the month with a unit about maps by focusing on the compass rose, as well as "zooming in" on a map from Earth, to the United States, then to NY, and finally to our school in the town of Colonie. Then we began learning our home addresses, and will continue to practice learning our address, as well as phone number throughout the month of May. It has been an exciting topic for our kiddos.

Our caterpillars have arrived and we have already observed their growth and recorded it a few times. We are excited to continue our learning about living versus non-living things and the life cycles of butterflies, frogs, birds, and plants and trees. To expand on these topics, a unit of pollinators and pollination will follow. Then we will continue on to insects, bugs, farms, and gardens.

We continue to plug away on learning math concepts. Addition within 10, finding the missing part of 10, subtraction within 10, and addition and subtraction word problems are the next unit's focus. Of course, we also continue to practice graphing, comparing numbers and groups, using flat and solid shapes, as well as counting up to 100 by 10s and 1s.

Our "Reading Teams" are doing well with practicing previously learned literacy skills independently. The kiddos have learned to read a chart that organizes the tasks of our one hour reading block and are feeling ownership of their learning during this time of day, Monday through Wednesday. Direct reading instruction in small groups is also provided during this time. The kiddos are thriving!

Before we close, we would like to wish the moms in our families a Happy Mother's Day. Look out for information about our upcoming Family Day (typically held somewhere between Mother and Father's Day).
