April Greetings! We ended March with a visit from Sheriff Taylor and her K-9 dog, Carney. Carney showed us how he can use scent to find lost or hidden objects in order to be a helper/part of a team. This visit provided a nice extension of ongoing social lessons and concepts in the Orange Room.

This month, prior to and following April Break (4/7-4/14), we will explore eggs/birds, seeds, pollination, living/non-living things, and life cycles. We will also create a story using our previously developed characters and settings by creating surrounding beginning, middle, and ending sequencing. We will continue to practice distinguishing fiction versus non-fiction texts, as well.

Also in our English Language Arts curriculum, we will work with the short li and Oo vowel sounds and the -it and -op word families. Letters for identification, writing, and phonics focus will be P, J, L, and R, K, A. We will also review sight words ("Popcorn Words") already introduced. This is a true favorite for our friends!

In our iReady Math curriculum, we will move on to understanding subtraction, and performing subtraction, within 5. As always, we will review counting, comparing groups, and using flat and solid shapes throughout our focus areas.

Finally, we will celebrate Ms. Danielle's birthday, as well as, Passover, Easter, Earth Day, Arbor Day, and hopefully, the true arrival of spring this month.
