

We've enjoyed the responsibility of jobs, which has blossomed into helping our friends, strengthening our own selfhelp skills, and caring for the classroom.

Happy spring everyone! We enjoy getting to go out on the playground more often, and we have had opportunities to take walks around the neighborhood as well. New life is beginning in our flower garden, and we have enjoyed tracking the weather and learning about clouds to close out March. In April, we will continue to explore spring with units on maps, Earth Day, life cycles, and baby animals.

In our Learning Without Tears Curriculum, we are finishing the alphabet with Xx and Qq. Then we will take time to learn more about vowels before beginning word families and word building. The kiddos are doing great matching beginning and ending sounds with the corresponding letter in words. We are excited to focus on vowels to get medial sound practice as well. We will continue practicing pre-writing and writing skills. We encourage labeling drawings and many are beginning to write simple sentences also. As always in our Mat Man letter books and other thematic books, we continue to think about characters, events, problem and solution, fiction vs. nonfiction, and character traits.

After a strong finish to our math unit on addition, we have moved on to subtraction. A solid foundation of understanding that subtraction means to "take away", "separate", and "get less/fewer" has been built largely using story problems. In April, we will spend time learning about subtraction equations and then practice both addition and subtraction math facts. By the end of April, we will move on to understanding teen numbers and developing a beginning understanding of place value.

We have no birthdays to announce or celebrate this month. We are looking forward to filling our Star Reward Jar for the second time, as we only have three more starts left to earn. Then, we will choose something from our class "bucket list" to enjoy together. We will keep you posted!
