It's hard to believe we're already heading into December! This month, we'll continue building on previous experiences with a month full of seasonal learning and celebrations. Our themes will include cold weather and warm clothing, gingerbread, holiday cooking, and celebrating one another. Children will explore the changes winter brings by exploring the clothing we wear to stay warm, participate in sensory play inspired by cold weather, and engage in creative art activities like mitten matching and winter collages. We'll also dive into a delicious gingerbread theme by reading stories, comparing gingerbread shapes, creating gingerbread art, and doing simple cooking activities that allow children to mix, pour, and explore ingredients.

We had a wonderful month of November! Our kids really loved exploring the medium of collage through our vegetable mural and Thanksgiving plates. The Violet Room children have adjusted well to changes in our schedule, they are able to sit longer for circle times, and are attending very nicely for small groups. The kids are forming beautiful friendships, they have our daily routine down, and they are becoming more independent each day.

We are ready to jump into winter and welcome the month of December! We will learn about winter activities, arctic animals, and winter holidays.

This month the children will get to play with sparkly white playdough to make hats, mittens, snowflakes, and snowmen! We will work on lacing beads onto snowflake pipe cleaners and we will paint with snowflake straws. These activities help the children to use their pincer grasp and works on hand-eye coordination as well.

For arctic animal week the Violet Room will make a watercolor painting with ice cubes and we will use pipettes to save arctic animals who are frozen in ice. This Is a fine motor skill, and will help strengthen little fingers.

Teachers will read *The Mitten* and kids will make a mitten craft using glue to stick the animals on. This will be great for working on multi-step directions.

To finish our month of December, we will make a special gift for moms and dads, and we will make latkes to eat!

We will be reading: The Mitten, Where Polar Animals Live, Five Little Penguins Slipping on the Ice, Polar Bear Polar Bear What do you Hear?, Penguin has the hiccups, Latkes Latkes, and Snowman at Christmas.

How can it be December already!? We hope that everyone enjoyed their Thanksgiving and had special times with their loved ones!

December themes will be holidays around the world (specifically Hanukkah, Christmas, and Kwanzaa). We will learn about needs vs. wants; use a gingerbread theme to practice counting, comparing, contrasting, and crafting/gift making; and holiday traditions. Be on the lookout for a special form to complete and return regarding family traditions. We will use them throughout December to highlight similarities and differences, and make connections, between our families and the books we read.

Letter learning and meaning making lessons using the letters li, Dd, and Hh will be the focus for our Learning Without Tears (LWT) curriculum. Not only will we practice phonemic awareness, but also understand story events and setting, as well as the character traits of persistence and kindness. Phonological awareness will be practiced using various holiday themed games related to rhyming and counting syllables.

Graphing, patterning, counting and comparing numbers/quantities will be the focus for math lessons this month. Math vocabulary such as more, less, greater, fewer, and equal to will be practiced in many ways.

The engagement the children show in our learning activities each day is in steady bloom. In particular, they enjoy the morning activities that allow them to access sensory, procedural, and social learning, which help them to start the school day more regulated and organized. The application of those baseline skills is crucial to further academic learning each day. Their independence is growing so nicely as well. Thank you for your support in helping to foster independence at morning drop-off.
