The Time flies! How can it be December already!? We hope that everyone enjoyed their Thanksgiving, and had special times with their loved ones!

December themes will be holidays around the world (specifically Hanukkah, Christmas, and Kwanzaa), as well as learning about giving and needs versus wants. Thank you for sharing about your traditions. We will continue to use them throughout December to highlight similarities and differences, and make connections, between our families and the books we read.

Letter learning and meaning making lessons using the letters Ee, Hh, and Tt will be the focus for our Learning Without Tears curriculum, while the letters LI, Hh, and Kk will be the focus for the Fundations curriculum. We have now introduced 24 "popcorn words" – can, see, look, in a, I, who, the, of, with, you, at, me, will, am, we, are, your, and, do, is, on, then, they. The children love finding them everywhere!

Using our iReady Math Curriculum and other supportive tools, the children will work on comparing number quantities within 10, then using attributes to sort and compare objects within 10. This will lead us into ways to make 10 (quantity combinations that add to 10). Graphing, patterning, and counting will continue to be practiced daily.

For science, we will learn about animals and how they protect themselves using a rainbow of colors as camouflage and their five senses. We will explore the tracks that animals leave in the snow and learn how to identify which animal made them.
