Orange Room News

It's hard to believe that it is already November! Time flies when we have fun while learning! We enjoyed our October themes. All were busy counting and graphing the contents of a witch's cauldron, planning and carving Jack-O-Lanterns, doing Halloween math games, learning about pumpkin parts and its life cycle, and enjoying sound words (e.g., eek, boo, scritch-scratch, etc.) during read alouds about Halloween.

As we move further into fall, we will explore what animals do to prepare for winter in our region. The topics of hibernation and migration will be researched, reported, and "published" into a class book as we learn about "making meaning" of what we read. Veteran's Day, Indigenous peoples, thankfulness, and family traditions will also be explored this month.

In our iReady Math curriculum, we will write, show, and decompose/make numbers 6-10 (6 is made of 4 and 2, 3 and 3, etc). Math vocabulary will include count, "and"/add, compare, fewer, less than, more, greater than, equal to, and same. We will continue counting by ones and tens to 100 as we fill more ten frames (crayon boxes) and count the days of school to 100.

We love finding and reading "Popcorn Words" – they are found everywhere! In November, we will also dive deeper into our literacy curriculum - Learning Without Tears. Phonics, letter identification, and writing formation of letters li, Dd, and Hh will be our "letter learning" focus for identification, phonics, and words with a given initial letter. The same letters will help us to develop "meaning making" of texts regarding characters; beginning, middle, and end story sequencing; events; and feelings and problem-solving. We continuously work with syllabication and rhyming.
