We have many exciting things planned for October as well. We will be learning about fire safety and will focus on what to do if there is a fire - stop, drop, and roll; stay low and go; get out and stay out; and call 911. The month of September sure did fly by! The month of September sure did fly by! The children are adjusting well to the structure, routines, and activities of the Orange Room. Throughout the month, we focused on getting to know each other and our classroom routines, as well as recognizing our own, and each other's names. New friendships have been blossoming this month! We also completed a unit on families. We are culminating that unit with a special Family Tree Mural in our classroom. Thanks so much for sending in your pictures!

During our morning meeting we began, and will continue, to introduce high frequency words ("popcorn words") each week. The children have a great time looking for these in our morning message and poem each day. We have begun to work with rhyming words and beginning letters of words and will continue to do so throughout October.

In September, our math program (i-Ready) focused on identifying numerals 0-9 and working on counting, representing, and writing to "show what we know" about those numbers. Next, we will move to comparing quantities 0-10. Writing practice of these numerals will continue this month and throughout the year.

In our literacy curricula – Fountas and Pinnell and Learning Without Tears - we began reviewing beginning letters and sounds, and alphabet order. We also introduced our poetry journals and worked on using pictures to give meaning to key words. We will continue to introduce a new poem each week.

Finally in September, we began discussing the life cycle of an apple tree, the parts of an apple, and practiced how to think like a scientist. Our science and social studies curricula for October will include activities related to fall, Indigenous People, pumpkins, leaves, nocturnal animals, and of course, Halloween. Please be on the lookout for more information regarding October activities and events. In addition to all of the other learning experiences, we will spend time learning about fire safety as well since October 9th-15th is fire safety awareness week. Please consider practicing an emergency plan and routine at home as well. We are excited to wish Elena a very happy birthday on the 17th!
